An Act respecting captivity and slavery-related reparations for descendants of Africa.

Preamble

WHEREAS the Executive Council of the African Union Forty-Fifth Ordinary Session, June 19 - July 19, 2024, did declare the African Union Theme for the Year 2025 as: "Justice for Africans and People of African Descent Through Reparations;"

WHEREAS the Caribbean Community and Common Market (CARICOM) Reparations Commission has lobbied Great Britain for the payment of reparations, including the address delivered by Professor Sir Hilary Beckles, Chairman of the CARICOM Reparations Commission, to the House of Commons and Parliament of Great Britain on July 16, 2014;

WHEREAS the Economic Community of States, Nations, Territories & Realms of the African Diaspora Sixth Region (ECO-6) has lobbied African kings for the payment of reparations, including the address delivered by H.R.M. Rex Semako I & VI King Timothy Elisha Mc Pherson, Chairman of ECO-6, to the Royal Council of the House of Kings on March 18, 2021;

RESOLVED that the kingdoms of Africa shall equally contribute to the rehabilitation of their own people who were taken away many generations ago by using resources of continental Africa to ensure the successful payment of reparations to the African Diaspora in this modern era;

DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Short Title

1 Short Title

This Act may be cited as the British Captivity and Slavery-related Reparations Act.

Interpretation

2 Definitions

Treasurer means the Treasurer of Reparations or such other member of the House of Kings as may be designated by the Treasurer of the Royal Council for purposes of this Act;

Captivity means the collective acts of intergenerational forced labour, slavery, genocide, brutality, and the multiple crimes against humanity as spurred by His Majesty of Great Britain and Ireland against The Majesties of the South, which for purposes of this Act shall be deemed to have commenced in August 1619 and to have terminated in June 2022;

3 Persons considered to be members of certain groups

A person of African descent whose ancestors were sold, kidnapped, or who voluntarily departed from Africa and was subsequently labelled as 'property' of British subjects in the region commonly referred to as the New World, whether or not the person continues to self-identify as an African today, shall, for purposes of this Act, be considered to be a member of that group entitled to reparations: And/or a person of African descent whose ancestors were sold, kidnapped, or who voluntarily departed from Africa and were subsequently prohibited from equal participation in the economy under the pretense of racial demographics.

Equality of Status

4 Status of males and females

Male and female persons under this Act have equality of status and equal rights of entitlement under this Act.

Evidence

5 Evidence

For the purpose of this Part, where official records of a person's African ancestry are not available, or racial demographics and genealogy are not self-evident, the Treasurer may accept a statutory declaration or like statement from anyone if

- a) At least one parent is of African descent, with genealogy in the Diaspora of at least 100 years;
- b) No information in the declaration or statement is contradicted by other evidence; and
- c) After taking into consideration such corroboration as may be available, the Treasurer is satisfied, on the balance of probabilities, that the information in the declaration is true.

Reparations

6 Reparations

Subject to this Part, reparations in accordance with the rates set out herein may be awarded to or in respect of any person of African descent, who, on application, requests such reparations.

A person of African descent is entitled *a priori* to receive on application the compensation equal to:

- i) **12190.5 grains of gold**

Non-exclusion from Future Reparations

Nothing in this Act shall be construed to prohibit recipients from receiving additional reparation payments in future from African kingdoms nor any other source whatsoever.

7 Children

Whereas a person to whom reparations are awarded is under the age of seventeen years, no reparations shall be paid to that person until that person attains the age of seventeen years.

APPENDIX A

Resolution 26202505-HK-01R: On The Calculating Of The Award Value

Calculating of the Award Value

In calculating the award, records of the Royal Council confer a historical discussion on reparations in the parity value of “*forty acres and a mule*”:

- a) historic value of 40 acres = US\$400, and
- b) historic value of one mule = US\$125
- c) combined historic commercial value of US\$525 and/or 12190.5 grains gold).

The United States Dollar during the period had an intrinsic value of 23.22 grains gold per 100 cents, and/or 23.22 grains gold per one unit of dollar, yielding a total value of 12190.5 grains gold for “*forty acres and a mule*.” The secondary market value for this award is (AKL) LUMI 3,047.62 per recipient (US\$83,504.92), whereby each (AKL) LUMI is underwritten by 100kWh solar energy and/or pegged at a value of 4 grains gold (0.2592g) per LUMI note.
