ORDER OF DISMISSAL BY ADJUDICATOR INTERVENTION

This Court retains jurisdiction to enforce the consent granted by the Republic of South Africa, et al., for all matters relating to a judgment at dispute for lands and other assets of Bakhlokoe Royal Trust Motawana, a change of venue being non-permissible without consent of this Court.

Concerned with the “*Dignity of the Court*” at risk of improper *ex parte* communication by the entry of the Applicant into the judge’s Chamber without the presence of his attorney or the Respondent during the adjournment of January 20, 2026.


IT IS ORDERED that Prayer 2 of the Applicant in the referenced case against Respondent King Letsitsa Moloi be and hereby is dismissed without costs. This Order of Dismissal shall not affect the claims of the Applicant against any respondents other than King Letsitsa Moloi.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the case continuation and judgment on Prayer 2, currently set for January 23, 2026, is hereby **CANCELLED**.

IT IS FINALLY ORDERED that the High Court of South Africa, Free State Division, Bloemfontein, the convening judge in the matter having acknowledged the first Respondent as being the monarch of the Bakhlokoe Nation, South African Diplomatic Passport bearer name King Letsitsa Moloi, and having publicly addressed the monarch as “Mr. Moloi”, being a punishable offence within the territories of the Bakhlokoe Nation wherein the Bloemfontein High Court presides, shall pay a fine of 50 cows to the Bakhlokoe Nation.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
